Rome's vintage gems

Twice Vintage

Trastevere, Via di San Francesco a Ripa, 7

Colorful, eclectic, with everything from 80s prom dresses to Levi's shirts and Disney sweatshirts. Ideal for bold casual looks and rare accessories.

Pifebo Vintage

Monti, Via dei Serpenti, 135/136

Two stores filled with 80s Nike, Patagonia fleeces, classic denim and a "kilo shop" system—pay by the weight, not by the piece! Don't miss their vintage sunglasses.

Sitenne

Esquilino, Via Cairoli, 55

Vintage meets costume lab, featuring creative upcycling, jewelry, and a strong sense of "community of style".

Flamingo Vintage

Monti, Via del Boschetto, 123

Well-preserved designer labels—think Chanel sunglasses, YSL shoes, and iconic structured dresses.

Michele Abiti Usati

Piazza Navona, Via del Governo Vecchio, 35

The thrill-seeker's paradise: racks packed by decade, wild leather goods, and a vast selection.

Cinzia Vestiti Usati

Piazza Navona, Via del Governo Vecchio, 45

From 60s cocktail dresses to 80s blazers, all at surprisingly fair prices.

Omero e Cecilia

Via del Governo Vecchio, 110

Exceptional curation, from band jackets to velvet suits, with one-of-a-kind hats and suitcases.

Fashion tip

Combine your vintage crawl with exploring picturesque neighborhoods, like Monti or Trastevere—many shops are close to local markets or cozy cafés.



Milan & Florence hot spots

In Milan try Ambroeus (Via Pastrengo, 15) and Cavalli e Nastri (Via Brera, 2 & Via Gian Giacomo Mora, 3)—legendary for high-end treasures. Florence fans, try local flea markets for artisan finds.

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Global must-visits: vintage shopping in London, Paris, New York

London

Don't miss **Reign Vintage**, **Rokit**, and **Beyond Retro** - from Covent Garden to Brick Lane, these icons combine British eccentricity with serious sartorial curation.

Paris

Go for **Kiliwatch**, **Thanx God I'm a VIP**, and neighborhood marchés for that true French flair.

New York

James Veloria in Chinatown is a Vogue editor favorite for rare designer pieces; Williamsburg thrift stores and vintage fairs burst with treasures.

for one-of-a-kind YSL blazers or a dream Chanel bag. Expect precise quality control.

Real-life tip: market adventures & garage sale hauls

Sometimes the rarest pieces appear at local flea markets, estate sales, or even pop-up vintage fairs. Bring cash, check for authenticity labels, and never underestimate the magic of a market find.

FAQ: your vintage shopping doubts answered

How do I know if a piece is truly vintage?

Check for era-appropriate labels, quality of materials, and ask sellers for provenance. Trusted online platforms (Vestiaire, Rebelle) offer authentication for designer pieces.

Can I bargain in vintage shops or markets?

Absolutely—especially in markets or with independent boutiques. Politely ask for a deal, especially if buying multiple items.

Are vintage clothes altered or repaired?

Many boutiques offer basic repairs or tailoring for the perfect fit. Always check seams, zips, and linings before buying.

Any tips for vintage online shopping?

Always check sizing charts, look for multiple photos, and read previous buyer reviews. When in doubt, ask the seller for extra details about fabric and wear.
